What is the Special Education Advisory Committee?

Every district school board is mandated by Ontario's *Education Act* to establish a Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC). The committee is appointed by the Board and made up of representatives of local associations, community agencies and trustees.

What is the role of SEAC?

SEAC plays a vital role in ensuring that exceptional pupils receive appropriate educational services and programs. SEAC reviews and makes recommendations to the Board on:

- The establishment, development and delivery of special education programs and services;
- The annual Special Education Plan; and,
- The Special Education budget.
